







DITP AND GIT MEET YUNNAN SME ASSOCIATION TO DISCUSS FURTHER COLLABORATIONS

GIT Signs MOU with Tanzania and Bureau Veritas to Promote Sustainable Gems and Jewelry Practices








THE JEWELLERS SHOWCASE OF UPCOMING THAI JEWELRY BRANDS
